HMRC people screening project to be topic of airport security seminar at  
TranSec World Expo in Amsterdam

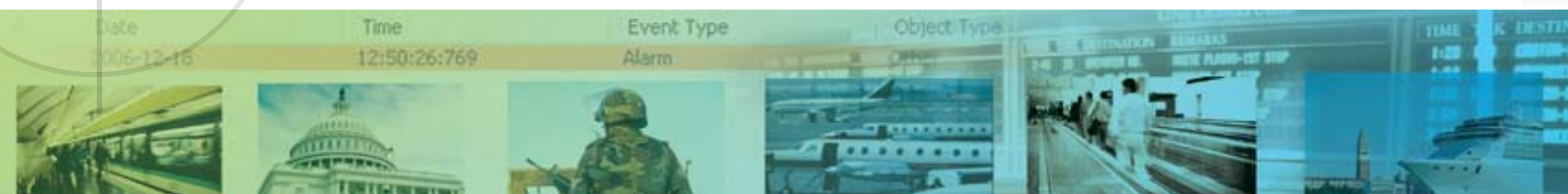

The system is employed to quickly and unobtrusively detect traditional contraband such as drugs and cash, which are part of the U.K.'s estimated \$35 million illicit drug market.

TranSec World Expo is a high-profile series of conferences and workshops offering a major forum in Europe for information exchange and networking with professionals from across the transportation security industry. In its sixth year, TranSec brings together end users, manufacturers and integrators from aviation, maritime, rail and supply chain security sectors from nearly 50 countries.
